

Family Café- Tuesday 12th February



<i>Read in their heads to themselves.</i>	<i>Read aloud to someone</i>	<i>Be read to by an adult</i>
 <p><i>A book at your child's reading level.</i></p>	 <p><i>A book either at your child's reading level or just above (because you are there to help them).</i></p>	 <p><i>Use this as an opportunity to expose your child to books slightly above their own reading level, which they wouldn't be able to access on their own.</i></p>
