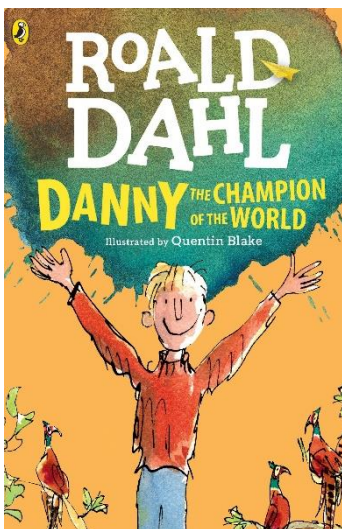
SUMDOG

Every child in the year group should have access to SUMDOG. It is a great way to get your child doing a little bit of maths without having to coerce them! Children should, as a minimum, be completing the home learning task on SUMDOG every week but they can access it at any time. If you do not have access to SUMDOG at home, then please let us know and we can arrange time in school for your child to do this.
