With the arrival of the warm weather, please make sure your child has a named drinks bottle in school each day to help them remain hydrated during the warm and sunny weather. If your child chooses to bring a hat to school to keep them cool from the sun, please ensure it is named. Please also apply any sun cream to your child before they come to school in the morning.

After school on Friday 14th June is the Friends of Angel Road Summer Fair. All children were sent home with a book of raffle tickets to sell to friends and family. If you have yet to return yours to school, then please do so next week. Any unsold books should be returned to the office for re-sale. Also on the 14th June, the children can wear non-uniform as part of the 'Norfolk Welcomes' Day. The children can wear yellow and green clothes and make a voluntary donation of £1, which will go to a Norwich based charity that supports refugees and asylum seekers.
